Description:	Appeal against the Enforcement Notice: Change of use of agricultural land for the storage of motor vehicles.

Main Issue:	The appeal is dismissed but the period for compliance is extended to 12 months. The Inspector found in the Appellant's favour on the issues relating to flood risk; effect on wildlife and the effect on living conditions. He also agave weight to the economic, environmental (in part) and some sustainability advantages that a Green Waste storage facility could bring to the area. However the Inspector notes that the use of the land is inappropriate and harmful in principle to the Green Belt. He details that it is significantly harmful to the openness of the Green Belt and that it is also significantly harmful to the character and appearance of this part of the open countryside. He concludes that the advantages and all of the other favourable considerations of the proposal do not clearly outweigh the harm, by reason of inappropriateness and the other harm to the Green Belt and the countryside.
