## **South East Airport Expansion Meeting**

## **Notes from John Stewart**

- 1. AirportWatch came together in 2000 to overcome NIMBYISM amongst airport community campaign groups. Later, national environmental organizations joined. One golden rule: fight our own corner but not suggest expansion goes elsewhere. It enabled us to engage in the wider political debate around aviation. And it brought success: runways at Heathrow, Stansted and Gatwick were all dropped. We fought together and we won together!
- **2.** A similar coalition, but including local authorities, came together to successfully fight the third runway at **Heathrow.**
- **3.** Banding together we as campaign groups, local authorities and environmental organisations, can once again set the terms of the debate. Transport Secretary has dismissed the efforts of the aviation industry as 'a pub-style debate'. The industry is simply repeating its old arguments and, with each airport fighting its own corner, shows little chance of developing a coherent aviation strategy.
- **4.** We have the chance to lead the debate by producing the sort of evidence-based research that the Transport Secretary is looking for. WWF, RSPB and HACAN are looking to commission research into capacity and connectivity. We will take comments on the brief beforehand.
- **5.** There is one other key point which much of the industry doesn't seem to have grasped. Both Thames Estuary and a third runway at Heathrow are almost certainly in the "too difficult" box as far as politicians are concerned. Strong campaigning will be the best way of keeping them there.
