### **Description of what the grant will be used for and justification for need:**

See table for details of how the funding will be used.

The administration is committed to enhancing and expanding library services in the Borough without increasing the burden on the council tax payer. An interim committee of the Friends of RBWM Libraries has been formed to establish the Friends. Membership will be open to anyone aged 15 and over who lives, works or studies in the Borough or is a member of the library service and supports the aim of the Friends which is to support the public library service with fundraising, promotional activity, volunteer support, reading development programmes and digital inclusion activity. The organisation is in the process of setting itself up as a charity and will then hold a public meeting to elect a committee of trustees to manage the organisation.

Start-up funds are required for the following:

- 1) Legal advice on the constitution in order to have the Friends established as a charitable organisation
- 2) To publicise the formation of the Friends and invite residents to participate, and in particular to attend a public meeting to elect a committee of trustees. The Friends will be most effective if it is widely supported by residents.
- 3) To establish a membership roll and to cover the administration costs of setting up and organisation.

1<sup>st</sup> Year funding will cover getting the group off the ground, initiating fundraising activities, publicising fundraising events and promoting the Friends through the work currently being carried out by the Library Service.

The Friends meet the following criteria:

- 1) **Increase volunteering** – the stated purpose of the Friends includes supporting the library volunteering programme
- 2) **Develop and put in place a community project** – the Friends will be a charitable organisation made up of members who have an interest in the Borough library service and wish to support those services through fundraising and promotional activity.
- 3) **Support the Borough's Big Society projects** – The Friends of RBWM is a Borough Big Society initiative
- 4) **Work with and secure the support of local businesses to engage in volunteering or community projects** – The Friends will target individuals and commercial organisations in fundraising activity
- 5) **The setting up and development of voluntary organisations or social enterprises** – the grant will be used to set up the Friends of RBWM Libraries which will be a voluntary organisation created to support Borough libraries.

This initiative is open to all Housing Solution tenants. We will be contacting a minimum of 7000 individuals who reside in a Housing Solutions property. This year we are offering 5 of the 20 available places to wider residents within RBWM..

### Big Society Aims

Following on from the success of the 2012 programme, Housing Solutions are going to host another Start Your Own Business Course in collaboration with the Aspire Foundation.

Paul Funnell and Richard Lanning from Aspire continue to champion the role of enterprise, entrepreneurship and employment in helping unlock the potential of people who've been written off by society, to discover confidence, skills and to achieve their aspirations. This year's graduates have had nothing but praise for the Start Your Own Business course and are already implementing the skills learnt.

The thirteen residents who attended the programme have commented that the range of skills taught to them through the workshops has completely turned their lives around. They now have increased self confidence, self belief and self worth. They now have faith in that they can and will start a business and a business that will grow and be successful.

They have commented on how the course has motivated them to take control of their lives and that running their own businesses has enabled them to influence what their future holds. Please see attached sheet for Graduate testimonies.

The Aspire course has the tag line of "Dare to Dream" which essentially gives our residents the power of self belief and that no matter what their circumstances or their business experience that it is possible to be your own boss and be successful. The Aspire Foundation has numerous examples of course attendees who have created businesses which are rewarding them financially.

The course given by Aspire gives our residents the opportunity to discover the tools to start and run their own businesses and possibly, in the long term a joint social enterprise with Housing Solutions. For example, one 2012 graduate is in the process of entering into a gardening maintenance contract with Housing Solutions.

As before, we will invite residents to join us for an award winning package of training, ongoing business support, start-up grants and office space to help get them started. This year's graduates are already promoting the programme by word of mouth and such promotion is invaluable.

As this year's programme, next year's participants will attend a series of weekly workshops delivered by successful entrepreneurs from the Aspire Foundation. The programme focuses on outcome rather than pure business theory. We will be actively encouraging tenants from all backgrounds to apply by removing barriers, for example, to attract residents who are not keen or confident in their writing ability they can apply via a dedicated phone line. The application process will also be via the website and an online form where they can register their interest. Our Facebook page holds key information regarding registering interest for the 2013 course and has the tagline "Dare to Dream".

The programme covers : researching the market, raising money to start the business, starting up (unravelling the red tape), who to ask for help, information, finance and support, business planning, managing risks, sales and marketing.

The sessions also include identifying barriers that prevent individuals from starting their businesses and empowering them to overcome them. The programme has a strong focus on encouraging those residents to take control and make a positive change in their own lives and possibly the lives of others in their community depending on the type of business they wish to start up e.g.: local handyman service, gardening, dog walking business.

There also key elements of practical advice, personal development work, one to one advice sessions, assistance regarding applying for business grants as well as a graduation day. The programme culminates in participants presenting a business case to a panel with the aim of seeking a start up loan (Dragon's Den type scenario). Once the programme is completed there will be on-going business advice and mentoring. It is our intention to give our tenants the confidence and motivation to achieve their business goals.

The benefits of the programme not only aim to encourage the residents to become self sufficient and possibly create jobs for others, we will also be aiming to reduce the number who claim benefits.

We are extremely proud to be able to offer this alternative approach to combating unemployment and worklessness amongst our residents.

This year we will have a total of 20 places, which will include 5 places available for private residents from within the RBWM. We would work with RBWM to agree the target market for these places.

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**Description of what the grant will be used for and justification for need:**

The grant will be used to cover the cost of programme – one or more taster sessions (subject to interest) in mid November 2012 followed by 12 weekly sessions between January and April 2013. The programme will be rounded off by a Graduation ceremony which involves a Dragon's Den type scenario with a judging panel who will decide on which businesses will be awarded grants.

Again, we will be approaching Cllr Burbage to be one of our judges.

Twelve weekly sessions are scheduled from 10am til 4pm with lunch and refreshments at the offices of Housing Solutions in Maidenhead. If we are overwhelmed by interest we will seek bigger premises.

Post course we will have four quarterly meet up sessions for all graduates with Paul Funnell and Richard Lanning from Aspire where graduates can talk about their successes, challenges and seek advice from Aspire and their peers.

The grant will also contribute to our communications strategy which includes promotional literature production (Streets Ahead and other print advertisements locally, we will run a SMS text message campaign directly to our residents. Communications will also take the form of online and radio advertisements. We also wish to advertise in Around the Borough.

A proportion of the grant will be available as a business grant/micro fund loan and will be awarded to a tenant(s) based on a thorough appraisal of a detailed business plan and cash flow.

During the Mayoral year, Asghar and Naheed Majeed established the "Do-eat then Do-nate" initiative, as a means to build productive relationships between local businesses (in particular from the hospitality industry) and local charities.

The initiative was initially founded to facilitate the introduction of local charities to local businesses, with the objective that the local business would support their chosen charity through various ways including; asking their local customers to make small donations, running specific fundraising events/functions and encouraging volunteering work through the customers/staff by raising the relevant charities profile.

During the course of the Mayoral year the initiative expanded such that relationships were established between a wider range of local businesses and local charities which included donations of both money and resources such as the donation of a minibus to a local charity.

Consultation with participant business and charities has confirmed that there remains an appetite to continue and develop their involvement and that within the challenging financial environment the funding raised has been of significant benefit to many local charities. We have also been approached by a number of other local authorities who have expressed an interest in rolling out the initiative within their local authority area.

The Big Society funding is requested to enable the continuation and development of the initiative within the Royal Borough and to establish an operational model through which the initiative to operate within other local authority areas.

We are proposing to establish the scheme as the "One Borough Initiative" and the funding will be used assist with one-off set up costs which will be incurred including:

- Creating a new charitable trust or social enterprise
- Establishing the operational management processes and procedures
- Establish branding and intellectual property
- Set up and launch of a initiative website

- Recruitment of volunteer administrator and initiative champions

We believe our proposal fits strongly with the criteria for the Big Society funding in that it will enable the establishment of a new community led organisation to oversee the implementation of the One Borough Initiative, which is specifically designed to secure the support and engagement of local businesses with local charities. It will deliver increased social action within the local business community through fundraising and the provision of in kind support to local charities.

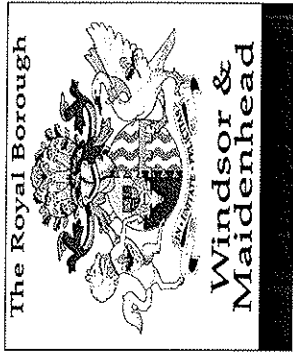

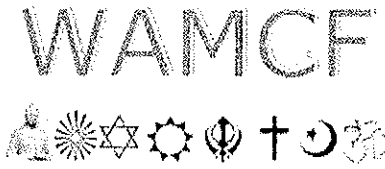

Windsor and Maidenhead Community Forum would like to apply for a grant to celebrate Diversity and inter-faith Week (19<sup>th</sup> Nov-25<sup>th</sup> Nov), and hold a Dinner to share food and music with partners (2<sup>nd</sup> December).

Salvation Youth Trust held a seminar at the Town Hall on 10<sup>th</sup> June where 5 leading members of the forum attended and shared our views. We felt that more interaction and dialogue is required between faith and community groups. There is little evidence of Muslim women taking part in community activities outside their own. This may be due to cultural and language barriers. WAMCF is planning to break there barriers and build bridges and try to reach out to all. Number of volunteers will increase and sustain.

Two adult learning centres are providing language and computer training and develop confidence. Many middle aged and senior members of BME group are benefiting. The objective of Inter-faith week and Diversity Day is to involve these hard to reach groups of women and youth.

- Inter-faith cricket tournament will take place on the first Sunday in September at Boyn Hill Cricket Club.
- We have arranged four bi-monthly visits to other faith centres. Inter-faith (Inclusive) Service will take place at the Methodist Church High Street on 25<sup>th</sup> November.
- Inter-faith dinner and diversity day will be celebrated at the Town Hall on 2<sup>nd</sup> December. Special efforts will be made to involve residents of Windsor and Ascot. WAMCF will provide some match funding for these activities. I have enclosed the details of the costing and plan/goals. We fully support borough policy and objectives.
