Background to the book: CAKE

The Ian Rennie Grove House Hospice covers areas of Herts, Bucks, Thame & Chinnor and all of Maidenhead. Cancer and other life shortening illness sufferers **and their families** are entitled to call upon the free services of the hospice. These services are wide ranging, including a 24/7 on call nursing service and the ability for people to die in their own home with full nursing support, should they wish to do so.

A recent survey shows that 70% of people wish to die in their own home, but only 20% are able to. With cancer now affecting 1 in 3 people, there will be numerous constituents affected by this situation at any one time.

The cookery book is my idea, to provide an interesting and on going means of additional revenue for the hospice, and in doing so would also raise the awareness of the hospice and its work, and very possibly lead to further fund raising and volunteering on the part of local people. I am not taking any money for doing this; all income will go directly to the hospice.



Street Angels launched in Maidenhead in February 2011. With singular exceptions, volunteers have been on patrol every Friday evening in Maidenhead Town Centre.

The work of Street Angels is now an established community project.

Street Supplies: It is amazing how the sugar rush from giving a person a lollipop can calm a situation. Flip flops are given out where shoes have been lost and also bottles of water to provide hydration. Occasionally taxis are provided to get someone home.

The evolving role

In just 14 months the night time economy has been changing as disposable incomes have declined. There is now a need for Street Angels to operate on Saturday evenings and selectively on Fridays. To resource Saturday evenings, when most of

our volunteers will have church commitments the following day, calls for a larger pool of people ideally rostered to work fewer weeks in the year.

A paid, part time co-ordinator, became necessary in Autumn 2011 to manage the roster of volunteers and energise the recruitment process.

Brian Martin, RBWM Community Safety Manager, has been involved with Street Angels since plans were first conceived and would be able to provide an impact assessment on the work that we have undertaken.

We are sufficiently confident in the medium term viability of Street Angels to be in the process of registering with the Charity Commissioners whereas we currently operate under a Small Charity Constitution.

The train the trainer group was established in 2011 and is supported by SDL which is a local Global Interpreting company based in Maidenhead. The group consists of five highly talented disabled people who have all gained a qualification to enable them to co-produce and deliver training packages. Since this time the group has developed and identified a need within the local community for a range of services that as a group they feel confident they could deliver. Currently locally there are no organisations providing disability awareness training delivered by disabled people and there continues to be a need for this training both in the public and private sector. The group would like to engage in a local schools programming providing awareness training. The group will also promote the benefits of volunteering as a route to employment to inspire other young disabled people to want to work. SDL continue to support the group by providing mentoring and business support and are keen to commit to a long term partnership. The group need start up money to set themselves up as a community interest company and it has been identified the group need a minimum of 15k to set themselves up.
