Background to the book: CAKE

The Ian Rennie Grove House Hospice covers areas of Herts, Bucks, Thame& Chinnor and all of Maidenhead. Cancer and other life shortening illness sufferers **and their families** are entitled to call upon the free services of the hospice. These services are wide ranging, including a 24/7on call nursing service and the ability for people to die in their own home will full nursing support, should they wish to do so.

A recent survey shows that 70% of people wish to die in their own home, but only 20% are able to. With cancer now affecting 1 in 3 people, there will be numerous constituents affected by this situation at any one time.

The cookery book is my idea, to provide an interesting and on going means of additional revenue for the hospice, and in doing so would also raise the awareness of the hospice and its work, and very possibly lead to further fund raising and volunteering on the part of local people. We have been very successful including in attracting ethnic minorities to the club of around 18% members. The club surrounds a wide diverse community and we have focused on inclusion rather than targeted the specific communities. However, as we are a non competitive club, this is one of the key features creating a non threatening environment. Therefore this inclusive approach greeted by our club reception for enquiries and signing in to our teaching staff enables clear strong role models encouraging people to participate. Furthermore, we have an increasing number of youth members helping, assisting or teaching which supports our work. Our pathways from swimming into lifesaving are clear. This ensures participants have opportunities to gain awards and qualifications but also allows them chances to join our teaching staff. The solution

The key is to ensure a friendly environment promoting equality and inclusion is essential. In addition, we have 10 Asian Women volunteer staff as themselves which reflects the community as well. The role models within the teaching and committee staff combined with the marketing of our club aids the participation rates. We have begun to run a series of the ScUK Equity in your Coaching workshop for our teaching staff and we have a clear club constitution and code of ethics that is adhered to. If you promote equality and begin to increase your ethnic minority representation on your volunteer coaching / administration staff, this will send a message for all to participate within the sport.

The future

We have expanded into providing learn to swim lessons for adults and this is proving to be popular. We have currently two classes with possible expansion. We endeavor this community session to only get bigger and have also two gym sessions at Braywick Fitness Centre on a weekly basis. The pool capacity is 30, we have a waiting list at both sessions at present.

Street Supplies: It is amazing how the sugar rush from giving a person a lollipop can calm a situation. Flip flops are given out where shoes have been lost and also bottles of water to provide hydration. Occasionally taxis are provided to get someone home.

The evolving role

In just 14 months the night time economy has been changing as disposable incomes have declined. There is now a need for Street Angels to operate on Saturday evenings and selectively on Fridays. To resource Saturday evenings, when most of

our volunteers will have church commitments the following day, calls for a larger pool of people ideally rostered to work fewer weeks in the year.

A paid, part time co-ordinator, became necessary in Autumn 2011 to manage the roster of volunteers and energise the recruitment process.

Brian Martin, RBWM Community Safety Manager, has been involved with Street Angels since plans were first conceived and would be able to provide an impact assessment on the work that we have undertaken.

We are sufficiently confident in the medium term viability of Street Angels to be in the process of registering with the Charity Commissioners whereas we currently operate under a Small Charity Constitution.
