#### Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP)

The LEP was incorporated in December 2011 and pulls together key players across Thames Valley and Berkshire representing education, employment and skills, SME and corporate enterprises, Local Authorities and the community sector - all working together to bring about a plan that will deliver economic prosperity for the next 20-30 years.

#### Flexible Home Improvements Ltd (FHIL)

This company was incorporated in March 2008 for the purpose of making loans to homeowners thus improving private sector housing. The company is initially funded by a grant from the Regional Housing Board and transfers amounts for subsequent loan to local authorities in Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Surrey.

#### **Kidwells Park Trust**

This Trust was established by J.M.Pearce who donated the land on which Kidwells Park and some surrounding buildings now stand. The funds in the Trust, resulting from the sale of the College of Art in Marlow Road, Maidenhead to Berkshire County Council, are temporarily invested pending agreement with the Charity Commissioners on their use for the provision of arts facilities in Maidenhead.

#### Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead Flood Relief Fund

Following approval from the Charity Commissioners, this Fund is the combination of funds established in 1949 to provide essential relief measures in time of flood.

### **Mayor's Benevolent Fund**

This Fund was established in February 1975 for general charitable purposes for the benefit of residents or persons working within the Royal Borough.

### **Working Boys Club**

This Trust received £613,000 on sale of 22 Cookham Rd, Maidenhead in 2008/09 and this has been invested in a fund to protect its value and ensure a revenue stream to finance the activities of the charity. The objectives of the charity are to provide facilities for youth in the borough with a preference for clubs and associations.

### **Thames Valley Athletics Centre**

Two sinking funds, created for the purpose of maintaining the athletics track and buildings, are invested on behalf of the TVAC Joint Committee.

#### **Other Trust Funds**

There are six small trust funds, each with a balance of less than £500 at 31st March. These trust funds are the Sunningdale Gravel Allotment Trust, Sunninghill Fuel Allotment Trust, John Lewis, D.E. Cooke, E Pasco and the Tester Award Drama Trusts.

#### **RBWM Commercial Services Ltd**

Covanta RBWM Ltd, which provides Waste Treatment and Disposal services, was acquired by RBWM as a result of it's American parent company Covanta Energy Corporation withdrawing from the UK waste market. As part of the process the name of the company has been changed.

At this time the closing balance of £458,000 is not material and therefore has not been consolidated into group accounts.

## INTRODUCTION

The annual report of the Working Boys Club is a legal requirement of the Charities Act and is produced for the annual meeting of the Trust.

### **TRUSTEES**

The Trustees are: Members of Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead's Cabinet acting on behalf of Council.

### AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The charity works in Maidenhead Berkshire.

The object of the charity is to provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, with the object of improving their conditions of life.

#### FINANCE

In 2008/9 the trust received £614,000 on the sale of 22 Cookham Rd. Maidenhead. This asset was previously held and managed within the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead's property portfolio on behalf of the trust.

The trust's funds are invested by the RBWM Treasury Management Team.

There is an agreement in place that any interest received on the investment is transferred in equal shares to the Marlow Road Community Centre and Marlow Road Youth Club.

## **CONCLUSION**

The receipt from the sale of 22 Cookham Rd. has been invested in a fund to protect its value and ensure a revenue stream to finance the activities of the charity.

### 1. INTRODUCTION

The production of the annual report of the Kidwells Park Trust is a legal requirement of the Charities Act. The Kidwells Park Trust consists of the full Council of the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead acting as Trustees (for details see Note 4). The principal address of the charity is: - Town Hall, St Ives Road, Maidenhead, SL6 IRF.

The scheme of 21<sup>st</sup> July 1971 regulates the purposes and administration of this charity.

## 2. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The Terms of the Trust permit the Council to assist in providing facilities for recreation and other leisure time occupations in the interests of social welfare for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead.

Grants from the Trust should be aimed at increasing cultural activity and targeting facilities or events that would not normally be provided without such assistance and excluding those items that would otherwise qualify for assistance under the Council's normal Revenue Grants Scheme. Wherever possible the Grants Panel aims to keep grants awarded in line with annual investment income.

Applications to the Trust for financial assistance towards events/items of equipment can be made on the basis of estimated figures, but actual evidence of expenditure incurred/to be incurred will be required for any monies to be released.

If the application relates to a one-off concert/performance, etc., for which income is to be received, details of all expected income are to be included within the application.

Any event or piece of equipment for which a grant was approved must be held or used within the Royal Borough and must be primarily for the benefit of its residents.

## 3. RISKS

There are no risks to which this charity is exposed.

## 4. FINANCE

The Kidwells Park Trust grants to be awarded for 2013/14 were discussed at a Cabinet meeting of the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead on 7<sup>th</sup> February 2013 and at quarterly grant panel meetings during the financial year.

After consideration of the applications, Cabinet resolved the following:-

That, subject to:

- (i) All the organisations concerned providing suitable acknowledgement for the grant assistance in all publicity material produced.
- (ii) Organisations ensuring that there was adequate insurance cover for items purchased with grant assistance.
- (iii) Organisations continuing to look for other forms of sponsorship for special events.
