## ITEM 5: CYCLING CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2012/13

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## 1. Purpose of the Report

1.1 This report provides an update on progress in delivering the 2012/13 capital programme.

## 2. Supporting Information

## **Background**

2.1 The 2012/13 cycling capital programme was approved at the meeting of the Cycle Forum on 18 April 2012. Progress is reported as follows:

## A4, Knowl Hill - improved cycle crossing

• Under construction – due for completion mid-February.

## Star Lane, Knowl Hill - surface improvement

- Scheme completed.
- Landfill Tax funding secured from Grundons.

## Kidwells Park, Maidenhead - cycle route

- Leisure services requested changes to the original scheme.
- Scheme designed.
- With Leisure Services for approval.

## A4, Maidenhead Bridge to Town Centre – cycle route (design only)

- Scheme design underway.
- To be progressed as part of Stafferton Way Link Road scheme.
- Local Sustainable Transport Fund bid did not secure funding for link road.
- Alternative funding sources for the Link Road scheme are being explored.

## Town Moor to Moorbridge Road, Maidenhead - cycle route

- Town Moor Master Plan consultation showed support for the scheme.
- Scheme design underway.

## Cox Green School – cycle parking compounds

Scheme completed.

## Ferry Road / Mill Lane, Bray - cycle gate

Scheme completed.

#### Clarence Road to central Windsor cycle route

- Scheme designed.
- Consultation completed.
- Barriers and mirrors added to subways to deal with illegal cycling.
- Shared use path in Hatch Lane deleted due to Tesco development.
- Additional waiting / loading restrictions added to deter parking in Hatch Lane.
- Programmed for March.

# Windsor Boys School – replacement cycle compounds

Scheme completed.

## Sunningdale Station to Dry Arch Road - cycle route

- Feasibility study completed showed that scheme cannot be progressed.
- Reserve schemes to be brought forward

#### **Reserve Schemes**

2.2 Over £40k is available for cycling schemes and the following reserve schemes that were approved at the meeting of the Cycle Forum on 18 April have been considered:

# Woodlands Park to Grove Park – cycle route feasibility study £2,500

Cannot be progressed due to objections.

### Furze Platt Infants / Junior Schools – cycle / scooter parking £5,000

Works to be funded from School Travel Plan funds.

## King's Road, Windsor - cycle route extension

£5,000

• Scheme completed.

## <u>Trinity Place, Windsor – cycle gate</u>

£10,000

Cannot be progressed due to objections.

## **Projected Outturn**

2.3 Given that we have been unable to progress several schemes as a result of objections raised by consultees, it is likely that the full budget allocation for cycling can be spent or committed to named schemes in 2012/13. We will seek to slip unspent funding to 2013/14, although there is no guarantee that this can be achieved.

## 3. Recommendation

3.1 It is recommended that members of the Cycle Forum:

- note the progress made
- identify schemes that can be delivered next year from funds slipped from the 2012/13 capital programme
