### **Report Summary**

- This report proposes that a sculpture trail be established in the parks and islands owned by RBWM along side the river Thames in Maidenhead to provide an opportunity for artists to display their sculptures and others to mount permanent exhibition pieces in permanent display space in public open space.
- 2. If approved the trail would provide a new visitor attraction in Maidenhead linking all the 4 riverside parks and the 5 river islands.

#### 1. Details of Recommendations

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the Leisure and Cultural Services Overview and Scrutiny committee approve the establishment of a sculpture trail along the Maidenhead riverside parks and islands, to be funded from £40k capital and explore the possibility of sources of sponsorship funding, going forward.

A report be prepared for Cabinet outlining the proposals for presentation in March 2014.

### 2. Reason for Recommendation(s) and Options Considered

- 2.1 The sculpture trail will provide a significant attraction for residents and visitors to Maidenhead encouraging walking along the Maidenhead riverside promenade and increasing use of local and other open spaces.
- 2.2 The sculpture trail will enable local artists to exhibit their art works to the public.
- 2.3. The initial capital fund will enable work to be undertaken in Guards club park and island with the aim to build on the initial phase, eventually providing exhibition spaces for sculptures on Reitlinger park, Bridge Gardens park, Ray Mill island, Bridge Eyot, Coke Eyot and Grass Eyot (3 islands)
- 2.4 It is suggested that the public could be asked to vote on what they feel is relevant art work to be commissioned for the new Maidenhead River Thames Sculpture Park, and then local businesses would be contacted to sponsor pieces for permanent display on the islands, with a theme of local relevance e.g. Wind in the Willows, 3 men in a boat, Sir Stanley Spencer, Swans etc.
- 2.5 A master plan showing the potential sites for exhibition spaces on all the parkland and islands is attached as appendix 1. This also shows the existing attractions in the parks concerned and how the potential exhibition spaces relate to them.

All the land is in the ownership of RBWM there is a requirement for additional paths on Guards Club island and for exhibition plinths to be provided in the public space. The £40k budget will enable the first 6 plinths to be constructed and path ways to be provided on the island. Additional funds will be required to provide further exhibition space on the other parks and provide lighting if required. This may be funded from s106 agreements in due course.

Revenue funding is required to maintain the additional exhibition features, paths and seats to a higher quality than at present.

### 5. Legal Implications

- 5.1 The provision of public art in public spaces is a local authority discretionary power.
- 5.2 Legal agreements with exhibitors will limit RBWM liability for any damage or theft to art pieces on loan.

The sculpture trail will provide a visitor attraction to the East of Maidenhead and provide residents will opportunities to exhibit their sculptures.


