#### Report

**Report for: ACTION** 

Item Number:

- 1. This report reviews the Library Sunday Opening Pilot at eleven library locations. Eton opening was piloted on Saturdays.
- 2. It recommends that Members agree to extend the pilot for 6 months to March 2015.
- 3. These recommendations are being made because they offer additional opportunities for residents in the Borough to make use of the libraries. They support the Council's commitment to enhance the Borough's library service.
- 4. If adopted, the key financial implication for the Council is to commit £28.3K additional revenue spend in the current financial year to allow the pilot to continue for a further six months.
- 5. This report also asks for agreement from Cabinet to review the performance of libraries on Sunday (and Eton on Saturday) in January 2015.

#### 1. Details of Recommendations

#### That Cabinet agrees:

a) That the Sunday opening pilot at eleven libraries (Maidenhead, Windsor, Sunningdale Container, Cox Green, Ascot, Cookham, Datchet, Dedworth, Eton Wick, Old Windsor & Sunninghill) and the Saturday opening pilot at Eton Library is extended for a further six months supported by additional revenue budget of £28.3K in the current financial year.

- b) That authority is delegated to the Head of Libraries, Arts & Heritage, in consultation with the Lead Member for Leisure & Libraries, to adjust the Sunday opening hours if necessary for the remaining pilot period after a survey of current and potential users has been carried out.
- c) That a report containing an analysis of performance of the extended pilot is prepared for Cabinet in January 2015 for a decision on whether or not to make the extended opening hours permanent from April 2015.

#### 2 Reason for Decision and Options Considered

- 2.1 On 30 January 2014 Cabinet endorsed the extension of the pilot of Sunday opening at four libraries (Maidenhead, Windsor, Cox Green & the Sunningdale Container Library site), for a further six months until 30 September 2014. On 27 February 2014 Cabinet agreed to widen the pilot to include 7 community libraries: Ascot, Cookham, Datchet, Dedworth, Eton Wick, Old Windsor & Sunninghill. As Eton was not already open on a Saturday like the other community libraries it was agreed to provide that option to residents.
- 2.2 It is recommended that the pilot of the extended weekend hours continues until March 2015. The 4 libraries that piloted Sunday opening from April 2013 are well-used (see Appendix 1). This is because Sunday opening is now embedded in the local communities and residents expect access to their local library on a Sunday. It will be possible to more accurately gauge resident interest and demand at the other locations by March 2015. There is evidence that business levels at Boyn Grove and Cookham is already high on Sunday when compared to Saturdays. Boyn Grove Library, however, is not part of the Sunday opening pilot as the new library was always intended to be open over seven days.
- 2.3 The extended opening hours have generally been appreciated by the residents using the Service. Sample verbal and written comments made during the extended pilot are given in section 14. The anticipated outcomes from the Cabinet Report dated 27 February 2014 can be viewed in the table below:

The outcomes so far are as follows:

#### Volunteer hours:

Volunteer commitment has proved more difficult to secure on Sunday than on other days. An average of 13hpw has been secured on Sunday and 18hpw on Saturday. Employees have been moved from Saturday working to Sunday working to enable all locations to stay open over weekends. Volunteers on Saturday have therefore made it possible for libraries to open on Sunday. An average of 31hpw volunteer commitment per weekend has been achieved.

Business levels on Sunday when compared to Saturday:

Sunday hourly rates of business exceeded Saturday at the Boyn Grove (not part of the pilot), Cookham, Maidenhead, Container and Windsor libraries. Sunday rates of business at Cox Green are 75% of those on Saturday. Rates of business at the other locations are less than 50% of Saturday levels. This report recommends that these locations are given more time to embed Sunday opening into the communities. (See Appendix 2)

#### Overall levels of business:

This target has not been achieved, so far, in the current year.

2.4 An option that has been considered would be to extend Sunday opening only to the community libraries with higher levels of business on Sunday. The table in Appendix A outlines levels of business during all the extended weekend opening hours. The library with the lowest levels of business is Old Windsor, which is substantially lower than all the other locations. Ascot, Sunninghill and Datchet also performed at a lower level than the other Community Libraries, however, with more time their performance is expected to improve. Nevertheless, if this option is to be adopted, it would continue with the Sunday opening pilot at Cookham, Dedworth and Eton Wick, Maidenhead, Windsor, Cox Green and the Container Library at Sunningdale until March 2015. Opening Eton Library on a Saturday would continue to be piloted for the same period.

- 2.5 A survey of existing and potential users is recommended to assess whether the current opening times of 11am to 2pm are the most appropriate. This is recommended to take place during October so that any changes that it suggests could be implemented before the final phase of the pilot concludes.
- 2.6 A final option would be not to extend the pilot. However, this would be contrary to the Council's commitment to enhance library services and would reduce the current level of access for residents.
- 2.7 The success of the current pilot has been reliant on volunteer support. A considerable amount of staff time has been involved in recruiting and training volunteers to assist with additional opening hours on a Sunday, which includes covering gaps created during the week by moving paid staff onto Sunday shifts. This resource would need to be maintained if the pilot continues.

#### 4. Financial Details

The approved revenue budget contains £1.64m in 2014/15 for employees in Libraries.

The financial implication of extending the pilot for a further 6 months is £28.3K additional revenue budget to be made available in 2014/15. £28.3k has already been allocated for the pilots for first 6 months of the year, and this report requests a further £28.3k for the second 6 months, thus the full annual cost of the pilot will be £56.6k.

#### 5. Legal

The Council has a statutory duty, under the *Public Libraries and Museums Act, 1964*, to provide a comprehensive and efficient library service to everyone that lives, works or studies in the Borough.

#### 6. Value For Money

Volunteer support alongside the additional paid staffing has enabled the Service to deliver the extra opening hours on Sundays (Saturdays at Eton) at a reduced cost and will continue to be necessary to continue to deliver additional opening hours at weekends.

#### 7. Sustainability Impact Appraisal

Relatively small impact through increased use of utilities. Continuous recruitment, training and management of volunteers will need to be supported by the Council. This is currently undertaken by an 18.5hpw Volunteer Officer and Library Supervisors.

#### 10. Equalities, Human Rights and Community Cohesion

An EQIA has already been completed for the extended opening hours as part of the work for the pilot. Staff were consulted about the new rotas and where possible requests were accommodated.

#### 11. Staffing/Workforce and Accommodation implications:

Staff are timetabled to work one Sunday in four. They are currently expected to cover locations other than their home location on a regular basis and move between locations while on duty to ensure all opening hours are covered. Volunteers will continue to work alongside staff to enable the additional hours to be delivered.

#### 12. Property and Assets

Increased use of the Council's buildings to deliver extended library services for the benefit of local communities.

#### 13. Any other implications:

During the extended pilot a review of the need for 'out-of- hours' ICT support to customers and staff was carried out. As a result of this review it is recommended that the LAHS Information and Digital Delivery Team is granted access to both of the Netloan servers. This software controls access to the public PC network in libraries. The ability for remote re-booting of the server by trained library staff would enable those on duty to resolve problems that required such a solution and would minimise potential downtime.

#### 14. Consultation

- An update of views from the Leisure, Culture and Libraries Overview and Scrutiny Panel will be made available to Cabinet.
- A full public consultation on opening hours was carried out prior to the start of the current pilot and its results were outlined in a report to Cabinet in October 2012
- This report recommends a specific survey about the actual opening times on Sundays is conducted to inform the proposed further extension of the pilot.
- Comments since April include:
  - o "Delighted about Sunday opening"
  - o "This is brilliant"
  - "We only came to find books on castles, but this was a really lovely surprise"
  - o "It's lovely now you're open on a Sunday"
  - "It's a very good thing that you're open on Sundays as I live just around the corner and can pop in"
  - "Really pleased that the library is open on Sunday as it suits me much better than Saturdays"
  - o "it's good to have somewhere to revise on Sundays"
  - o "Why on earth are you open on a Sunday, what a waste of time"
