# **Report Summary**

- 1. The Gambling Act 2005 requires the council as the licensing authority to have in place a statement of principles in relation to gambling in its area.
- 2. The existing statement had now been in effect since 2013 The attached draft is intended to replace that document and will be in force from January 2016 for a 3 year period when it will be revised again.
- 3. Members had previously authorised consultation on the draft and this report deals with the feedback from that consultation.

#### 1. Details of Recommendations

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the Licensing Panel recommends to Full Council that the new Statement of Principles should be adopted.

### 2. Reason for Recommendation(s) and Options Considered

2.1 This is a statutory requirement of the Gambling Act 2005

### 3. Background

- 3.1 Gambling is a relatively low level activity in the Royal Borough's area. There are 22 bookmakers, two racetracks and one adult entertainment centre (which allows gambling via slot machines).
- 3.2. There have been no problems associated with any of these premises over the past three years and there have been no complaints about the licensable activities at these premises.
- 3.3 The Council also authorises Society lotteries for organisations such as Parent Teacher Associations and Charities. Once again, this is relatively low level work and relatively few problems arise.
- 3.4 The Gambling Act 2005 provides for objectives which are to be the guiding principles in dealing with any applications. These are as follows:
  - i) preventing gambling from being a source of crime and disorder, being associated with crime and disorder or being used to support crime
  - ii) ensuring that gambling is being conducted in a fair open way
  - iii) protecting children and other vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling.

These objectives are expanded on in the draft Statement of Principles but, for example, they follow similar lines to the Licensing Act 2003 with which Members are now very familiar.

- 3.5 At the July 2015 Licensing Panel Members approved a draft wording of the new Statement of Principles (attached as Appendix A) and, in accordance with the Act and supporting regulations, authorised the Community Protection & Enforcement Services Lead to undertake a consultation exercise with interested bodies on the proposed Statement.
- 3.6 That consultation exercise was carried out and produced just one response, from The Racecourse Association, which is attached as Appendix B. This particular response was actually about the way the Statement is interpreted and put into practice and so does not necessitate any amendment to the Statement's wording approved by Members at the July Panel.
