

Activities of the forum

Funding and resources for Public Rights of Way

The forum discussed the issue of funding and resources for public rights of way projects, in particular with regard to developer contributions and grant funding opportunities. The forum resolved to investigate further any opportunities for external funding, and recommended to the Council that the procedures for developer contributions be reviewed to take more account of public rights of way projects.

Milestones Statement, and targets for the coming year

The forum was consulted on the Milestones Statement and Public Rights of Way Improvement Plan Annual Report 2011-2012, and recommended that the Council retain its current targets for the coming year, and wrote directly to the Chief Executive of the Council to urge that the existing staff and resources for public rights of way be retained.

Windsor Great Park Easy Going Routes

The forum has been closely involved with the development of the Windsor Great Park Easy Going Route, holding a joint site visit in October 2010 with delegates from the Bracknell Forest Local Countryside Access Forum and disabled users to examine the proposed route and offer suggestions and improvements, which fed into the revision and redesign of the proposed route.

Chiltern Society 'donate-a-gate' scheme and volunteer works

The forum welcomed a presentation from the Chiltern Society regarding the donate-a-gate' scheme run in conjunction with Buckinghamshire County Council. This led to a detailed discussion about how this kind of scheme could be operated within the Royal Borough, and also how the Council could partner with volunteer organisations to deliver path

improvements. The forum continued to monitor the progress of working with volunteer groups and suggested various additional avenues of opportunity for volunteer works.

LAF website

Taking advantage of expertise offered by new members, the forum approved a detailed and extensive review of its website, which had remained largely unchanged since 2003. The changes suggested are currently being implemented.

Public Rights of Way and planning applications

The forum delegated a sub-group of members to meet with the officers of the Council to discuss concerns regarding public rights of way and planning applications, leading to the agreement of a number of actions to address the concerns raised.

The Millennium Walk

The forum continued to monitor the progress of the 'Millennium Walk' project, and placed it on the list of items to be reviewed at every formal meeting of the forum.

Local Access Forum Fast Response Team

The Fast Response Team, set up by the forum to respond to consultations that fall outside of the forum's formal meeting dates, responded to the following requests for advice on behalf of the forum:

- Farmers Close / Culley Way alley gating order consultation March 2011
- Planning application at Town Moor, Maidenhead April and June 2011

Other issues that the forum has discussed during 2010-2011:

- Horse grazing issues
- Non-standard barriers on cycle tracks
- · Activities of neighbouring Local Access Forums.
