The advice received is that the signs and set up for the Multi-use route are fine and provided the surface is suitable there is unlikely to be any liability issue for the Council.  A situation where two users of the path were to be involved in an accident would be determined on the facts of each individual case, if there was actually

	a liability distinction; there doesn't have to be a party held legally liable for every accident.
	The injured party would have to demonstrate, on the balance of probabilities, that the other party acted negligently. They won't be liable for any damage which is "too remote", or was not reasonably foreseeable
	Even if there is a liability the party to the accident will not be successful in a claim against the other unless they can show that they've suffered loss e.g. loss of income or payment of a medical bill.
