## **UPDATE**

RBWM no longer use site notices for planning applications in respect of tree work in Conservation Areas. The reason for this decision was to reduce the amount of administration and associated costs.

Such site notices had previously been necessary when they were the only means of displaying information about intended tree works. However, the Council now publishes all information on the RBWM website providing a broader notification system at a lower cost.
