# ROYAL BOROUGH OF WINDSOR AND MAIDENHEAD PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY: 6-MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT

#### FEBRUARY - AUGUST 2011

#### 1. ENFORCEMENT

#### 1.1. Problems closed and problems reported

Approximately 45 enforcement problems have been closed during the period 1<sup>st</sup> February to 1<sup>st</sup> August 2011 and approximately 28 new problems were reported during that period.

On 1<sup>st</sup> August there were **183** outstanding enforcement problems recorded on the rights of way database, 17 fewer than on 1<sup>st</sup> February when there were **200** problems recorded (summary at Annexe A).

#### 2. MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT

#### 2.1. Problems closed and problems reported

Approximately 69 maintenance problems have been closed during the period from 1<sup>st</sup> February to 1<sup>st</sup> August 2011 and approximately 45 new maintenance problems were reported during that period. On 1<sup>st</sup> August there were **121** outstanding maintenance problems recorded on the rights of way database, 24 fewer than on 1<sup>st</sup> February when there were **145** problems recorded (see summary at Annexe A).

#### 2.2. Works due to be carried out

The following projects are scheduled to be carried out in the next 2 to 3 months:

Maidenhead FP 19 and Cookham FP 48 (The Green Way)	Improvements to footbridge approaches/ramps
Bray FP 53 (Windsor Road to Oakley Green Road)	Squeeze stiles to be replaced with gates
Hurley FP 63 (Mill Lane to the Thames Path)	Surface improvements
Waltham St Lawrance FP 25 (Billingbear Park)	Stile to be replaced with gap/staggered barrier

#### 2.3 Community Payback

A work team provided by the Probation Service "unpaid work in the community" project carried out path clearance work on a number of public footpaths in Bray Parish over two days in early August. It is intended that similar work days will be arranged on other public rights of way in the borough in the future.

#### 3. PARTNERSHIP WORKING WITH EAST BERKS RAMBLERS

#### 3.1 Condition surveys

Local volunteers from the East Berks Ramblers (EBR) carry out regular inspections of the public rights of way network, based on a rolling programme of surveys in Spring and Autumn each year. This provides the Rights of Way officers with valuable information by helping to identify problems on the ground, or areas where there may be scope for improvements. The Council pays EBR a grant of £1000.00 per year (administered through the Parish Paths Initiative) as a contribution to the running costs of this project.

The information obtained from these surveys is also used to compile the annual performance indicator that measures the percentage of public rights of way that are easy to use. The Spring 2011 survey results indicate that 97.4% of the path network is "easy to use". These surveys were previously carried out in-house by the public rights of way team, and use of the volunteers for this work has freed up approximately 2 weeks officer time to focus on resolving the problems that are identified by the surveys.

#### 3.2 Removal of stiles and other access improvements

The Rights of Way Officers are working closely with the East Berks Ramblers on priorities for stile removal projects and other access improvements.

During the period access improvements were made on the following footpaths:

Eton FP 3 (off Common Lane)	Stile replaced with Kissing Gate
Bray FP 49 (off Fifield Road)	Stile replaced with Kissing Gate

#### 4. DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT

## <u>Definitive Map Modification Order applications (path claims) currently being investigated</u>

#### 4.1 Shottesbrooke claimed footpath 501(Pundles Lane)

A Definitive Map Modification Order application received in May 2007 was refused by the Council in February 2010. The claimed footpath runs from Shottesbrooke Footpath 12 to Waltham St Lawrence Footpath 38.

The applicant appealed against the Council's refusal of the claim, and the case was referred to Planning Inspectorate, who deal with rights of way appeals on behalf of the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs.

In June 2011 the Planning Inspectorate allowed the appeal and directed the Council to publish a Definitive Map Modification Order (DMMO): the Order is

currently being prepared. There is a statutory right of objection to such Orders and in the event that objections are received the case will need to be referred back to the Planning inspectorate to be determined by means of a public inquiry or written representations.

#### 4.2 White Waltham claimed footpath 501 (land at Ffiennes Farm, Littlewick Green)

A Definitive Map Modification Order application received in August 2008 was determined in July 2010. The claimed footpaths run from White Waltham Restricted Byway 4 (School Lane) southeast to and around a small copse, then northwards to White Waltham Footpath 9. The application has been partly accepted and partly refused: an Order has been made for the paths to and from the copse, but the applications for the paths through the copse have been refused.

Objections were received to the Order and the case has been referred to the Planning Inspectorate. A public inquiry into the Order has been scheduled for 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> March 2012.

#### 4.3 Wraysbury claimed footpaths 501 to 505

Five Definitive Map Modification Order applications were received in June 2009 for footpaths crossing land at Thamesfield, north of Wharf Road, Wraysbury. A Village Green application has also been received for the land crossed by these claimed footpaths, and the Village Green application is being processed first before the footpath claims are investigated further.

#### 4.4 Cox Green claimed footpath 501

A Definitive Map Modification Order application was received on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2009 to add to the Definitive Map a footpath running from Culley Way to Farmers Close. The application was accepted, and a Definitive Map Modification Order was made on 15<sup>th</sup> March 2011. Objections have been received to the Order and these objections are currently being assessed.

#### 5. CHANGES TO THE NETWORK

#### 5.1 Waltham St. Lawrence Footpath 25 (Billingbear Park)

On 11<sup>th</sup> May 2011 a Diversion Order was made to divert part of Waltham St. Lawrence FP 25. The Order involves diverting the legal line of the footpath to follow the line already used by the public, and will include surface improvements and removal of a step-stile which can cause access difficulties for some path users.

No objections were received to the Order during the statutory consultation period and the order will therefore be confirmed and the access improvements implemented.

#### 6. PARISH PATHS INITIATIVE (PPI)

The Royal Borough continues to operate the Parish Paths Initiative (PPI). All parish and town councils in the borough are members of the scheme. The British Horse

Society, East Berks Ramblers and National Trust are also members. Annual grants are paid to Cookham and Old Windsor Parish Council's who organise path clearance works in their parishes.

Discussions are currently underway with a number of parishes concerning potential projects to be carried out later on in the year. The project has also worked with the National Trust to ensure that some permitted paths in Cookham are kept clear and open for use.

#### 7. ACCESS TO ETON-DORNEY FOR 2012 OLYMPICS & PARALYMPICS

Major surface improvements have been carried out on the section of the Thames Path between Windsor and Dorney, and on the Green Way through Bray Wick Park, to enable improved access for walkers and cyclists visiting Eton-Dorney Lake for the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

The works have been funded by a grant of £200,000 from the Olympic Delivery Authority, as part of a partnership project between the Royal Borough, Bucks County Council, Slough Borough Council and SUSTRANS covering a network of paths that provide links to the Games venue.

#### 8. MILLENNIUM WALK

One of the priorities set out in the "Milestones Statement 2011/12", approved by the Rights of Way and Highway Licensing Panel in March 2011, is to "Seek to complete the missing links in the Millennium Walk."

#### 8.1 Missing link between Lower Cookham Road and Thames Path National Trail

Discussions are currently taking place with the landowners and the Environment Agency on a proposal to create a new public footpath from Lower Cookham Road to the Thames Path. As well as filling a "missing link" in the Millennium Walk (which runs across the north of the borough from the Thames at Hurley to the Thames north of Maidenhead), this footpath will provide a useful new link to the Thames Path and a link in various circular routes based around the Thames Path and the Green Way.

A funding contribution of £50,000 towards the cost of creating the new footpath has been secured through a S.106 Planning Agreement relating to redevelopment of the former 'Stiefel Laboratories' site off Lower Cookham Road.

However, it should be noted that this funding will not become available until commencement of the development, and implementation of the footpath project is therefore dependent upon the timing of the development.

#### 8.2 Missing link between Hurley Footpath 18 and Bisham Footpath 20 (Speen Hill)

A permitted path agreement has been completed between the Berkshire College of Agriculture and East Berks Ramblers for a new permitted footpath across land owned by the College, emerging onto Henley Road opposite an existing footpath across Temple Golf Course (Bisham FP 20).

Due to poor sightlines at the golf course entrance, a short section of roadside footpath is be constructed to enable walkers to cross at a safer point along the road. Appropriate warning signage and road markings will also be installed as part of this project.

Design work for the roadside footpath is currently in progress, and it is anticipated that the works will be carried out in October 2011.

This project is part-funded by contributions from the East Berks Ramblers and Maidenhead Civic Society, the remainder being funded through the Council's 2011/12 capital programme.

#### 9. PUBLICATIONS

#### Public Rights of Way Improvement Plan 2005-2015

The Public Rights of Way Improvement Plan is part of the Borough's Local Transport Plan 2006-2011 (now rolled forward to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2012).

The Improvement Plan was published in 2005 as a requirement of the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000. The Plan was produced following wide ranging consultations, and identifies a range of potential improvements to the public rights of way network. Annual updates are published as part of the Milestones Statement.

#### Milestones Statement 2011/12

The Milestones Statement & Public Rights of Way Improvement Plan review for 2011/12 was approved by the Rights of Way and Highways Licensing Panel on 7<sup>th</sup> March 2011. The document reviews progress made on public rights of way work in the previous year sets out a range of targets and objectives for the current year.

#### Borough Website

The Public Rights of Way section of the website contains comprehensive information about public rights of way in the borough, including contact details, problem report forms, downloadable leaflets, registers of path claims, and Highways Act landowner declarations. A copy of the Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way is also available on the website.

#### 10 LOCAL ACCESS FORUM

The Local Access Forum was set up in 2003 to advise the Council on improvement of public access to land in the Royal Borough for open-air recreation, as required by the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000. The Forum has adopted the following vision statement: "a partnership to promote and develop sustainable access for the growing benefit of the environment and all in our community".
