Title: 2013-14 Dedicated Schools Grant Settlement

1 SUMMARY AND PURPOSE

1.1 This paper provides details of the finalised 2013-14 Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) settlement received on 19 July 2013. It updates Schools Forum members about changes to RBWM's DSG allocation since it was last discussed at Schools Forum on 11 July 2013.

1.2 Schools Forum members are asked to note the contents of this report.

2 BACKGROUND

2.1 In July 2013, Schools Forum received a report setting out RBWM's 2013-14 DSG settlement as announced by the Education Funding Agency (EFA) on 19th December 2012 and revised in February and May. The report reminded Forum about the proposed distribution of funding in the 2013-14 Early Years, Schools and High Needs Blocks between schools' delegated budgets and central services and funding changes that were notified by the EFA after RBWM's 2013-14 Budget Statement¹ was submitted to the EFA in March. Following the July meeting, the EFA has now published RBWM's final DSG allocation. It is a requirement of the grant conditions that Schools Forum is notified of the finalised allocation.

3 2013-14 DEDICATED SCHOOLS GRANT SETTLEMENT – MARCH 2013

3.1 The DfE 2013-14 DSG settlement announcements in December and March confirmed RBWM's DSG allocation to be £99.221 million (table 1). These figures were reported to Schools Forum in July 2013.

3.2 Funding from the Education Funding Agency (EFA) for post 16 pupils estimated to be £9.102 million, and an allocation of £500k from the DSG surplus², increased the total funding in the 2013-14 Schools Budget to £108.823 million³ (see table 2)

3.3 The distribution of the £108.823 million between schools and central services within the Schools Budget, summarised in the Section 251 2013-14 Budget Statement and shown in **Annex A**, was agreed with Schools Forum and submitted to the EFA in March 2013.

4 FINAL 2013-14 DEDICATED SCHOOLS GRANT SETTLEMENT – JULY 2013

- 4.1 The final 2013-14 DSG settlement announced on 19 July has now confirmed further funding adjustments totalling £244k that were notified too late to be included in the March Section 251 Budget Statement. The report on the DSG settlement to Schools Forum in July alerted members of the Forum to the first two of these, but not to the last two:
 - An increase of £161k in the funding transferred from the EFA for post 16 high needs resulting from 2011-12 high needs learner numbers data changes.
 - An increase of £163k, also for post 16 high needs, following the consideration of RBWM's request in March for a post 16 High Needs budget review.
 - A reduction of £72k in Early Years funding reflecting 17 fewer early years pupils (at £4,247.85 per pupil) than originally recorded on the EY census.
 - A reduction of £8k relating other minor adjustments.
- 4.2 These changes in the July settlement confirm that the finalised 2013-14 DSG allocation, before recoupment for academies, is £99.465 million (see column 3 in table 3).

It was agreed to increase this level of funding by £184k, and allocate £500k of the surplus to delegated schools' budgets and central services to supplement the 2013-14 DSG allocation.

4.3 These changes increase the total funding in the 2013-14 Schools Budget from £108.823 million to £109.067 million when the DSG surplus allocation and post 16 funding is added in (see table 4)

The £72k adjustment for the change in early years pupils will be allocated as a budget reduction to the Early Years Individual Schools Budget (line 1.0.1 in annex A)⁴. The other adjustments totalling £316k will be allocated to the High Needs top-up budgets (line 1.2.1 to line 1.2.3 of Annex A).

5 Recoupment of DSG for Academies

The Dedicated Schools Grant figures discussed above include funding for academies. The EFA, not RBWM, has responsibility for funding academies, and will 'recoup' from RBWM's DSG allocation during the year the funding that relates to academies, including a proportional amount for any in-year converters. The Individual Schools Budget (line 1.0.1 of the Section 251 Statement shown at Annex A) includes £22.537 million which existing academies would have received through the funding formula if they were maintained schools (see table 5). A further amount of £807k will also be recouped for St. Mary's Catholic Primary, which converted on 1 July 2013.

5.2 The EFA will also recoup £89,974 relating to funding for resource units in academy schools for the period April to August 2013. The calculation is based on the amount of funding recouped from RBWM for academy resource units in 2012-13. During this period academies operated on the old funding system. No further amounts will be recouped for the period September 2013 to March 2014 as baseline adjustments have been made to RBWM's 2013-14 DSG allocation to reflect the new funding arrangements for academies which take effect from September 2013.
