### 1. DETAILS OF RECOMMENDATIONS

**RECOMMENDATION:** That the Cabinet Participatory Budget Sub Committee notes the progress to date in implementing the Member budgets programme for 2015/16.

### 2. REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION(S) AND OPTIONS CONSIDERED

2.1 Councillors have spent some or all of their funds. A total of £14,600 has been donated so far during the 2015/16 financial year.

- 2.2 A total of £28,150 remains in the budget to spend between 42 Members, eight of whom have spent part of their allocation to date.
- 2.3 Members' budgets is a Manifesto commitment, which states 'use Member individual budgets to continue spending on very deserving causes'.
- 2.4 Members are able to carry their funds forward into the next financial year if they are not spent in full in 2015/16 by the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2016 deadline.
- 2.5 All Members have been informed about the scheme and how to donate their funds. Officers are available to answer any questions Members may have regarding this scheme.
- 2.6 Members with remaining funds will also be informed of those groups and projects that were unsuccessful in receiving funds from our Neighbourhood Budgets scheme, and also those local groups who may have been unsuccessful in the annual Community Grants application process.
