TFMV- Theft from motor vehicles.

Windsor Central= 63 reported with 2 arrests

Windsor West= 54 reported with 0 arrests

Windsor East= 34 reported with 0 arrests

Theft of Motor Vehicle

Windsor Central= 10 reported with 1 arrest

Windsor West= 6 reported with 0 arrests

Windsor East= 8 reported with 1 arrest

Theft of Pedal Cycle

Windsor Central= 14 reported with 0 arrests

Windsor West= 6 reported with 2 arrests

Windsor East= 3 reported with 0 arrests

Business Burglaries

Windsor Central= 12 reported with 2 arrests

Windsor West= 4 reported with 0 arrests

Windsor East= 10 reported with 1 arrest

Residential Burglaries

Windsor Central= 7 reported with 1 arrest

Windsor West= 42 reported with 2 arrests

Windsor East= 26 reported with 2 arrests

There was a request for further figures in relation to serious crime so I have included the following;

Robbery

Windsor Central= 6 reported with 2 arrests

Windsor West= 3 reported with no arrests

Windsor East= 2 reported with 1 arrest

Assault with Injury

Windsor Central= 62 reported

Windsor West= 28 reported (I have not done the arrests as most of the assaults have arrests)

Windsor East= 25 reported

Obviously things are a little more uncertain at the moment and police are discussing contingency plans at high levels for all eventualities. During the last period PCSOs and community wardens have been completing leaflets drop to approximately 1,000 houses around West Windsor. These leaflets contain up to date security information and the offer to have a home security survey. These surveys have proved to be successful and products can be installed to help target harden. PCSOs show what advise what should be done and when a person clearly does not have the money to install a device then this can be funded by the police. For example a fake security camera or Window shock alarms.

It is worth noting that over the last 2 weeks (not included in this forum) that burglaries are substantially reduced which is probably linked to more people working from home or self-isolating. This will mean that crime will evolve and more information on this can be found on the latest criminal scams or tactics;
