Public Rights of Way comments

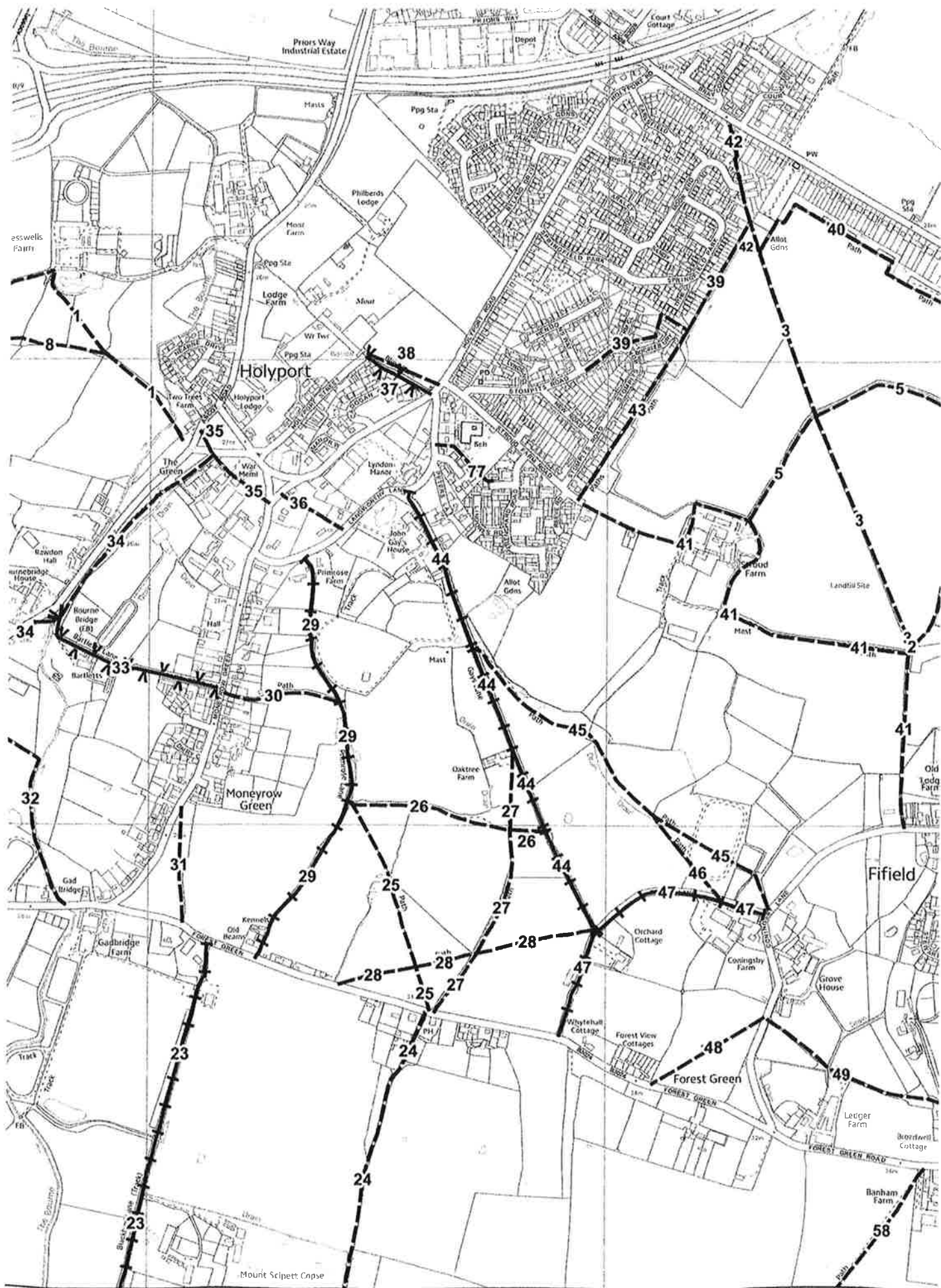
I object to the above application for a Premises Licence, on the grounds that the proposed events would have a significant adverse impact on the Public Rights of Way network.

There are three Public Footpaths (Footpaths 26, 27 and 28 Bray) and one Public Bridleway (Gays Lane, Bridleway 44) which run alongside or across the application site: see attached extract from the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way.

These public rights of way provide links in a number of circular routes within easy walking distance of residential areas in this part of the borough, and are clearly very well-used.

It appears that no regard has been given in the licence application to the presence of these public rights of way.
