#### REPORT SUMMARY

Following the outcome of the local elections held on 4 May 2023, the Council has a duty under the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 to review and determine the representation of the different political groups on bodies appointed by the council.

Proposals for changes are set out within the report including the reduction of Overview and Scrutiny Panel membership and removal of requirement for political proportionality from Area Forum membership so that instead one councillor is drawn from each relevant non-parished Ward.

#### 1. DETAILS OF RECOMMENDATIONS

#### **RECOMMENDATION:** That Council notes the report and:

- i) Notes the political balance of the council as a result of the local elections held on 4 May 2023 as detailed in paragraph 2.1;
- ii) Approves the membership of the committees, panels and forums for the ensuing Municipal Year as detailed in Appendix A;
- iii) Appoints the Chair and Vice-Chair for the ensuing Municipal Year as detailed in Appendix A;
- iv) Delegates authority to the Service Lead Electoral and Democratic Services to amend/make further appointments on the nomination of the relevant Group Leader;
- v) Delegates authority to the Monitoring Officer to amend the constitution as appropriate in light of any amendments to the structure of Panels, Committees and Forums as detailed in Appendix A

# 2. REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS AND OPTIONS CONSIDERED Options

2.1 In accordance with Regulation 8 of the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990, Councillors have given notice to the Chief Executive of their wish to be regarded as members of political groups. The number of seats held on the council is therefore as follows:

Liberal Democrats: 22 seats (55%)

Local Independents (the Borough First and Old Windsor Residents'

Association): 9 seats (22.5%)

Conservatives: 7 seats (17.5%)

West Windsor Residents' Association (WWRA): 2 seats (5%)

- 2.2 A political group for this purpose is a group of two or more members.

  Councillor Larcombe (National Flood Prevention Party) is the only councillor who is not a member of a political group.
- 2.3 The allocation of seats is determined by applying the political balance rules prescribed by Sections 15 and 16 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 and supplemented by the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990: Seats on relevant committees must be allocated to different political groups so far as reasonably practicable in accordance with the following four principles:
  - (a) that not all the seats on the body are allocated to the same political group;
  - (b) that the majority of the seats on the body is allocated to a particular political group if the number of persons belonging to that group is a majority of the Council's membership;
  - (c) subject to paragraphs (a) and (b) above, that each political group is allocated the same proportion of the total seats across all the ordinary committees of the Council as the proportion of the members of the Council that belong to that group;

and (d) subject to paragraphs (a) to (c) above, that each political group is allocated the same proportion of the seats on each relevant body as the proportion of the members of the Council that belong to that group

The Council's overriding duty to comply with (a) and (b) above takes precedence over achieving a mathematically balanced distribution of seats as described in (c) and (d).

The rules are designed to ensure that the political composition of the Council's panels, committees and forums as far as possible replicates the political composition of Full Council. The Council therefore has a duty to make appointments to those bodies giving effect to the wishes of the political group allocated the seats.

- 2.3 The political balance rules do not apply to the Health and Wellbeing Board, in accordance with the Local Authority (Public Health, Health and Wellbeing Boards and Health Scrutiny) Regulations 2013. The terms of reference for the board require three councillors to be appointed, to include Lead Councillor(s) with responsibility for Adult and Children's Services. Councillors are asked to also make the appointments to the Health and Wellbeing Board as detailed in Appendix A.
- 2.4 The Council is also required to appoint the Chairs and Vice-Chairs to each body, with the exception the Overview and Scrutiny Panels which shall select a Chair and Vice Chair for the ensuing municipal year from their respective memberships at the first meeting of each Panel. The proposed Chair and Vice Chair appointments are detailed in Appendix A.

#### **Area Forums**

2.5 The Windsor and Maidenhead Area Forums will no longer be politically proportionate as there is no legal requirement for them to be considered under the political balance rules. The Forums have therefore been removed from the overall calculations as set out in Table 3. Instead, one councillor will be drawn from each of the unparished wards within the relevant area as set out in Table 2 below:

#### **Audit and Governance Committee**

2.6 As agreed at Audit and Governance Committee on 25 February 2023, recruitment of independent members will be undertaken to improve oversight of the Council's risk management arrangements. The Constitution will need to be amended to allow for the co-option of independent persons to the Audit and Governance Committee. It is proposed that the Committee's terms of reference be amended to allow for the appointment of up to two co-opted independent, non-voting members.

#### **Overview and Scrutiny Panels**

2.7 In response to feedback from the Local Government Association (LGA) Corporate Peer Challenge (CPC) in January 2022 the Council moved to three Overview and Scrutiny Panels. This was to be more closely aligned to the priorities in the Corporate Plan and service delivery arrangements covering people, place and corporate functions. As part of the recommendation their membership was increased to 11 councillors for the municipal year 2022-23. The new administration have proposed that the size of each Panel be reduced by two with Corporate, Place and People Overview and Scrutiny Panel each having a membership of nine councillors.

## **Constitution Working Group**

2.8 As agreed at the Council meeting on 27 April 2021, a Constitution Working Group was established comprising five Councillors. Although not included in the overall proportionality calculations representation will be based on current political balance. The membership of the Working Group will comprise of 3 Liberal Democrats, 1 Local Independent and 1 Conservative representative. Group Leaders have been requested to nominate Councillors from their respective Group and preferably represent their groups themselves. This enables Councillors of the Working Group, with the support of relevant officers, to meet in an informal setting to discuss potential future amendments to the constitution. The Working Group will then present their recommendations to future full Council meetings for debate in public and approval by all Councillors.

## **Appointment Committee - Executive Director, Resources**

2.9 As set out in Appendix A, Appointment Committees will be set up with five Members (politically balanced) to include Leader of the Council (Chair), Deputy Leader of the Council (Vice Chair) and relevant Cabinet Member if appropriate, established on an 'as required' basis. The Council is currently recruiting to the position of Executive Director: Resources and is due to meet on Friday 26 May. The membership of the Committee to consider candidates will be Councillors Adam Bermange (LD), Maureen Hunt (C), Lynne Jones (LI), Simon Werner (LD) and Mark Wilson (LD).
