The documentation provided appears to deal only with nitrate pollution. We would like to see an unequivocal statement from the EA that there is no danger to human health from pathogens originating in the turkey droppings entering the water vlagus and adverselv effecting human health.

As this application is due to come to Panel on 20 September, please can the requested assurance be obtained urgently.

development involves the rearing of turkeys, turkey litter presents a risk to groundwater resources in the area, with the HRA identifying the main risk as nitrogen. There would be no slaughter or processing activities on the site. The site will only be used for the placement of turkeys during the rearing season (17 weeks).

In their comments, the EA has confirmed that the HRA and FRA provides them with the confidence that it will be possible to suitably manage the risks posed to groundwater resources by the development which is the subject of this planning application.

The EA has therefore removed their objection to this application. However, as set out in sections 10 and 13 of the Officer's Report, conditions are recommended to ensure that this is suitably controlled, including in relation to manure control and a surface water drainage scheme.

With regard to pathogens, Appendix G of the HRA contains a South East Water Visit Report from January 2022. As part of the duties of a Water Supply Company, South East Water have to ensure the highest safety standards for any water abstracted for treatment and distribution from their abstraction boreholes at Whyteladyes Lane. The report South from East Water following their visit raised no concerns regarding pathogens migrating to the point of abstraction as a result of the proposed development. Furthermore, any potential risk would be eliminated by proper water treatment processes deployed by the water supply company.
